

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Great is Thy Faithfulness

Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass.

1 Thessalonians 5:24

As we complete our 15th year of ministry, our number one goal remains the same, "To glorify our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ by the willingness to take the gospel to all creation." Our desires should be the same as our heavenly Father "who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth."

There are far more people born into this world than those who are born again. The Pew Research center reports that Christians have declined sharply as a share of the population here in the United States and it appears that part of the problem lies within Evangelicalism itself.

When pollster George Barna asked conservative pastors how they measured personal success, the top five answers were 1) numbers, 2) giving, 3) number of programs, 4) number of staff and 5) the square footage of the facility. If that is the criteria for success, then Roman Catholicism, Mormonism and the proponents of the Health and Wealth gospel, to mention a few, must be deemed very successful. One needs to ask, "What about the Great Commission and the inward conviction of personal evangelism?"

Some time ago, I sent a letter to all who remain in my high school graduation class explaining the need for salvation. Someone said that was a good idea. It was not a good idea but a conviction coming from the Word of God. If you want a good idea, get on the internet, go to a Christian bookstore, attend a conference or get on the mailing list of a popular ministry. If you want a conviction to share the gospel, prayerfully go to the Scriptures and ask the Lord to burden your heart for the souls of men.

Hudson Taylor would never have left the European Continent with just a good idea. He was convicted that while his church was hearing the gospel weekly, there were millions in China dying without hearing it once. Mission EURASIA reports of the 7.38 billion people in the world 3.12 billion have no church or gospel witness in their part of the world.

With success so high on the agenda today, churches must guard against the church itself becoming the "peck-measure" under which it hides its light. Last year we visited a church that had 21 programs listed in the bulletin, but not one of them had to do with personal evangelism. I just received a publication that listed ten characteristics of an effective church and not one of them emphasized the need of evangelism. Perhaps what we deem so

successful and effective is not so with God. We often object to evangelism without follow-up and discipleship, but do we object to discipleship that does not result in personal evangelism? Discipleship, as we see it in the New Testament, moves believers out of their comfort zone, into a world that is in need of the Savior. Church leaders have become experts at keeping people in their self-confined comfort zone with buildings and programs while the world around them knows not the Savior.

Jesus began His discipleship by telling two fishermen, "Follow Me and I will make you fishers of men." He ended His discipleship right before His ascension by saying to the disciples, "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; you shall be my witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to

the remotest part of the earth." From beginning to end, it was evangelism. Would you expect anything less from the One who came "to seek and to save that which was lost?" Would He expect anything less of those who claim to follow Him?

Les Lofquist writes, "But we have been so preoccupied with defining the Gospel (which is important) and defending the Gospel (which is also important) that we have neglected declaring the Gospel (which is tragic). Jerry Smith adds, "Evangelism must not be confused with church growth, since the entire focus and motivation is different. It may result in church growth, but that is not the focus... As the saying goes, many people are talking about evangelism but not many are doing it."

Thankfully, our Lord Jesus Christ left the comfort of heaven to die on a cross for the souls of men. George Whitefield and John Wesley followed the example of the Lord and left

the comfort of their own churches to proclaim the gospel to those who were perishing. J.C. Ryle writes:

For the truth's sake, Whitefield and Wesley, in the eighteenth century, denounced the mere barren moral preaching of the clergy of their day, and went out into the highways and byways to save souls, well knowing that they would be cast out from the communion of their church. And who shall dare to say that they were wrong?

Beginning with our very first year, the Lord called us out of our comfort zone to proclaim the gospel in the Russian Federation. In Siberia, we slept on the ground, on cold floors, on islands for our safety, on soiled mattresses in fishing cabins and in abandoned houses. Three times we were personally attacked. We were arrested, interrogated, finger printed and fined by the local militia and the Russian FSB. However, we paid little price compared to what the Lord did for the **souls of men.** Was it worth it? With no church or gospel witness, village after village and their students, too many to officially count, heard the gospel first hand leading to three churches being established. And during twelve years of ministry in the Republic of Tuva, it gained the distinction of having the most evangelicals per capita of all the states and districts of Russia.

In October of last year, the Lord by His grace, opened the door for us to share the gospel face to face at the 106th Northern Navajo Nation Fair. Eleven hundred Navajos heard or received the gospel in print, among a people where less than 10% know the Lord as their Savior. In September of this year, we were at the Navajo Nation Fair in Window Rock where nearly 1500 people heard or received the gospel in print. This year alone, we mailed over 2500 follow-up letters, again explaining their need to turn to Christ for salvation.

At the end of our fifteenth year, we pray that our God-given conviction and zeal for the lost would not give way to the pursuit of personal comfort and success. We pray the Lord will continue to open doors and entrust us with the treasure of the gospel. We pray the same for His church and missions all across the world. Regardless of what lies ahead we know for certain, **"Great is Thy faithfulness!"**


Seven Areas of Ministry

Siberian Youth Camps

We continue to financially support Siberian children and youth camps in Susch and Baj-Xaak. The majority of the parents in Susch are alcoholics and as a result there is little money left for food. We provide the funds to feed the children when they come to Bible study each week and make certain they all receive a Bible.









Seven Areas of Ministry

Siberian School Evangelism

The Lord opened the door and called us to the front lines of evangelism in the village schools of Siberia. We presented the gospel and gave every student and teacher a booklet on salvation and a Bible in the Russian language. This door is now closed for us as this is in violation of the 2016 Yaroya Law prohibiting such evangelism. Pray that the Lord will open the door for us again.







Seven Areas of Ministry

Siberian Church Planting

In our ten years of traveling to the Republic of Tuva, we were instrumental in the establishment of three local churches: Susch, Baj-Xaak and Shivilig. The church in the small village of Shivilig has always been a house church and regardless of recent changes in Russian law, the saints of Shivilig (pictured below) have not wavered in their faithfulness to worship together.

The Faithfulness of God in Opening Doors for the Gospel

"Praying at the same time for us as well, that God may open up to us a door for the word, so that we may speak forth the mystery of Christ..." Colossians 4:3

On the mission field you learn that God uses both the leading of the Holy Spirit and adversity to open and close doors. The Apostle Paul experienced this when they "were trying to go into Bithynia and the Spirit of Jesus did not permit them." With that closed door, God opened the door in Europe where Paul also experienced doors being closed due to opposition.

God opened the door for George Whitefield to come to America to proclaim the gospel during the Great Awakening of the 1700's. But when he returned to England he was met with great opposition. He wrote in his Journal, on December 10, 1738, "But I rejoice in this opposition, it being a certain sign that a more effective door will be opened since there are so many adversaries."

At BKI we know it was through both the Spirit's leading and adversity that the Lord made our mission a reality. As a mission, we learned you must trust the Lord to open doors.

On one trip into Siberia alone, Bob Campanella recorded forty-two answered prayers. The following is an example of the Lord's faithfulness.

In the fall of 2006, we began a boat trip up the Yenisey River to Torah Hem, a village of 3,000 with no roads leading in or out. The trip had been planned for two years but just two weeks prior to departure the boat was sold. The Lord answered our prayer and and provided another boat just one day prior to departure.

The first night we stayed in a fishing cabin near Seva. It was bitter cold but we were able to witness to villagers

and some responded to the gospel. The next night, in Irban, a Russian man invited us into his house where we slept on the floor. The floor was hard but the room was warm. The next three days and nights found us in an abandoned house near Torah-Hem. All the furniture was left behind but there was no way to build a fire as the chimney was full of debris.

When passing through Irban, we felt led to go to the school but a local member of the Russian militia tried to prevent us. We told him we had already been approved by the principal and were not in violation of Russian law, so we proceeded. He called in the militia's district agent, a large Russian man, who stood by and observed our presentation. After giving

the students a bible – only one student previously had one - the agent immediately approached me. His opening words were not what I expected when he said, "I like what you are doing." I am sure Jesus would have said to me, "O, you of little faith."

During our conversation he asked me where I was going next. I told him to Torah-Hem, although we had been told we would not be welcome in the school there. He responded, "I will go with you and get you into the school." Two hundred and fifty students heard the gospel and received a Bible that day in Torah-Hem. Only the Lord can open such doors. God is faithful!
